

How to find us

Kirkstall Abbey sits within Kirkstall Abbey Park and is approx. 3.5 miles from the city centre of Leeds. By bus: Bus numbers 33, 33a and 757 travel from the city centre to Kirkstall Road. By train: The nearest train station is Headingley which is a one mile walk from the museum. By car: If you are using a route planner, our postcode is LS5 3EH. Parking: A large free car park with disabled parking is situated next to Abbey House Museum on Abbey Walk.



Uncover the history of one of the best preserved medieval Cistercian abbeys in Britain. With its beautiful and iconic ruins, award-winning Park and interactive visitor centre Kirkstall Abbey is a place that visitors of all ages can enjoy.

The Ruins

This charming structure, which is still standing substantially complete up to its full height, presents a unique example of early Cistercian architecture. From the majesty of the church to the peace of the cloisters enjoy walking through one of the most complete examples of a medieval Cistercian abbey in Britain.



The Visitor Centre

Today the story of the abbey and its community is explored in the Visitor Centre. Founded over 800 years ago in 1152, discover more about this famous Leeds landmark and what life was like for the Cistercian monks who lived there for nearly 400 years.

The Park

Enjoy the abbey's spectacular parkland setting next to the River Aire. Take a walk along the river or enjoy a picnic in the picturesque open spaces. There is also a small children's playground near to the car park for the little ones to enjoy.
